



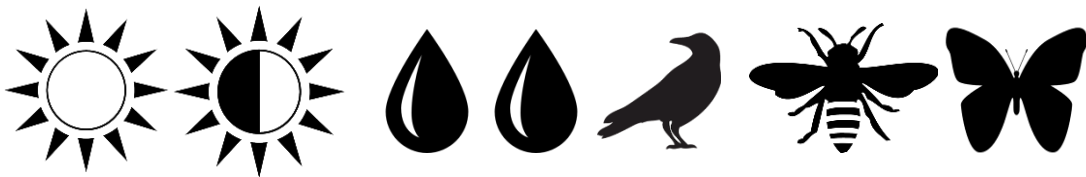
Downy Serviceberry

Amelanchier arborea



This plant produces multitudes of small white flowers in spring before leaves. The leaves follow, and are covered with soft, downy hairs that fade with age. Reddish-purple berries are edible, providing food for wildlife and people. As fall approaches, leaves turn a gorgeous dark red. In some areas, this plant blooms just as shad, an American fish, ascends freshwater streams to spawn, giving it its other name “shadbush”.
