



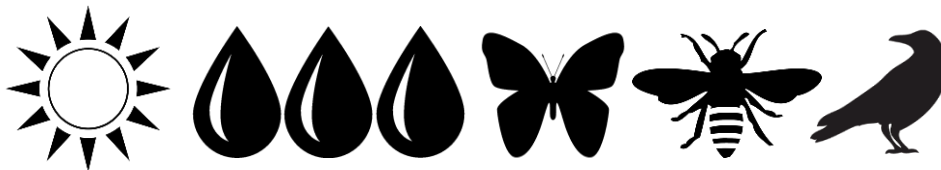
Groundsel Bush

Baccharis halmifolia



Fast growing and salt tolerant, the groundsel bush – or marsh elder – produces white flowers that attract butterflies, bees, and other native insects. Birds may also forage on the seed produced. It is the only member of the daisy family to get to tree size. Individuals are dioecious – flowers are of one sex. Males are not as showy and appear yellowish while females appear white. Plants can be as nearly wide as they are tall.

- Grows 15 feet
- Found in salt marshes, wet disturbed areas
