



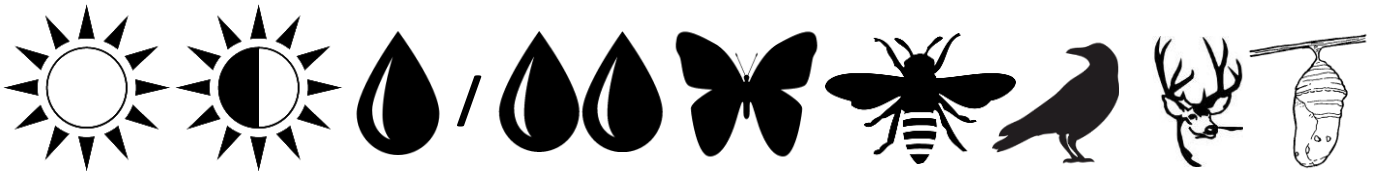
Partridge Pea

Chamaecrista fasciculata



A member of the pea family, this plant produces bright, yellow flowers in the summer that attract bees and butterflies. Seeds are produced in pods and eaten by birds. The plant itself is a food source for sulphur and sleepy orange butterfly species. Also called “sensitive plant”, like *Mimosa pudica*, this plant’s leaves will fall forward and droop if touched. Collect the seeds to sow again for next year.

- Annual
- Grows 1-3 feet
- Found in open woodlands, prairies, meadows
