



# Flat-topped Goldenrod

## *Euthamia graminifolia*



Also known as grass-leaved goldenrod, this plant has narrow leaves and flat-topped flower bunches. Stems have fine, white hairs. Flower bunches bloom gradually. Plants spread by rhizomes, and can be a weed in sunny, moist sites. Unlike *E. caroliniana*, it does not bloom into December. Some moth species use this as a larval host. Some seeds are consumed by birds, and wildlife may graze on the foliage.

- Perennial
- Grows 3-6 feet
- Found in prairies, marsh edges, dunes, fields
