



Camphorweed

Heterotheca subaxillaris



Hairy stems bear yellow, daisy-like flowers around 1-inch in diameter. Seeds are born on fluff that disperse in the wind. Crushed leaves smell similar to camphor, hence the name. This plant can be sparse in growth habit, and should be paired with fuller plants if placed in the garden. Tips can be pruned in spring to early summer to create a more bushy habit. Can re-seed heavily; remove seed heads to prevent unwanted spread.

- Annual / biennial - Grows 5 feet - Found in upland areas, dry roadsides
