



Railroad Vine

Ipomoea pes-caprae



Also known as beach morning glory or goats foot. An evergreen vine that can be grown as a groundcover or for beach stabilization. It grows from the dunes almost to the water's edge on beaches. The leaves are thick and succulent like, and provide the basis for its other common name since they resemble goat's feet. Flowers are deep pink and attractive to bees and butterflies. Prune regularly to in check if using in a traditional garden setting.

- Perennial - Grows 20+ feet - Found in dunes, beaches
