



Switchgrass

Panicum virgatum



This is an attractive clump forming grass. When in flower, purple stigmas give the plant a touch of color. In the fall, leaves turn a pale yellow, lending that autumn look to yards, and it lasts through the winter. Birds will eat the seeds and this plant is also a larval host for at least two species of skipper butterfly.

- Perennial
- Grows 3-6 ft
- Found in prairies, moist roadsides, open woods
