



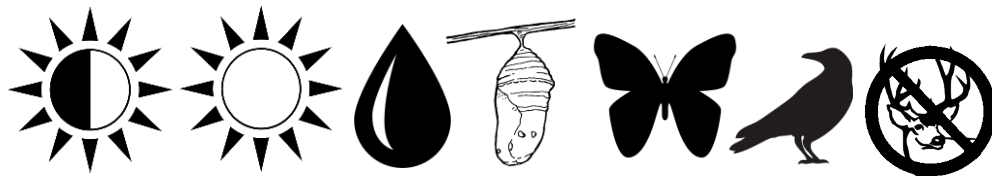
Little Bluestem

Schizachyrium scoparium



This grass forms dense mounds. Blue-green stems appear in August and by September become mahogany-red with white seed tufts that provide food to small birds. The best thing is that this color remains throughout the winter. As an added bonus, this is a larval host for at least six species of skipper butterfly. It reseeds readily.

- Annual/Biennial
- Grows 3-6 ft.
- Found in dry sandhills, disturbed areas
