- Coastal WildScapes participated in the annual Butterflies of the Atlantic Flyway - Migratory Butterfly counts. Mid Aug – Mid Nov.



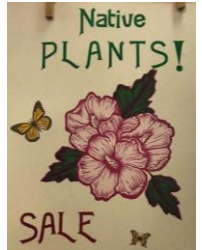
